

OLL VOTER REGISTRATION DAY

Omicron Lambda (OLL) supported Voter Registration Day by teaming up with the Pulaski County Clerk's Office and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. to host a Voter Registration event on the campus of Arkansas Baptist College, Little Rock, AR.

We had a great turnout. Members of OLL were able to educate and motivate the students on campus by discussing that voting is a civic duty and each vote matters.

Dr. Calvin Jerome McFadden, Baptist College President, and Ms. Terri Hollingsworth, Pulaski County Clerk, were both appreciative of our chapter for supporting one of the key freedoms of American life, voting.

Exercising our right to vote is still the single most powerful practice to affect change in our democratic society. Since the Emancipation Proclamation, legislatures across the country have erected barriers to the black vote. The practice was most prevalent in southern states with Jim Crow laws. These barriers have included, but have certainly not been limited to, literacy tests, poll taxes, property-ownership requirements, and moral character tests. Another impediment was a grandfather clause that permitted otherwise ineligible white populations to vote if their grandfathers were able to vote. These clauses were used at a time when the grandfathers of black people were not allowed to vote because they were slaves. The term "grandfather clause" or being "grandfathered" is still widely used today in many other contexts. Although Congress passed the Voting Rights Act of 1965, which was federal legislation intended to prohibit racial discrimination in the voting process, the practice of discrimination and voter disenfranchisement continues today.

At 62 percent, Arkansas ranks last in registered voters. Omicron Lambda Lambda is committed to the continued efforts of community UPLIFT through voter education and registration. This practice is a true testament to the principles of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.



Reverend Asriel Gamaliel McLain, an Associate Minister of Little Union Baptist Church, located in Shreveport, Louisiana, and a native of Ruston, Louisiana, was invited by Senator Bill Cassidy to be the guest Senate Chaplain.

Reverend McLain is a member of the Rho Omega Chapter in Shreveport, Louisiana. Since becoming a member of the Rho Omega Chapter, he has held several positions of leadership. He has served as the Ninth District Chaplain. He has served in the capacity of Rho Omega Reporter and he has held the office of United Omegas of

Some of his accomplishments as District Chaplain include a bi-weekly Bible Study, Weekly Video Devotional Message, Virtual Worship Services, and Collaboration with state chapter Chaplains. He also participates in the Fraternity-wide prayer calls and works tirelessly with the Ninth District council members who connect the Fraternity with the community.

Reverend McLain is also a noted community servant. He is currently a life member of the NAACP. He is a board member of the North Louisiana Civil Rights Coalition. We are indeed proud of the Fraternity's representation by Reverend Asriel McLain on the Senate floor. The first Senate meeting, held in New York City on April 25, 1789, elected Reverend Samuel Provost, an Episcopal Bishop of New York as its first Chaplain. RIDING FOR A CAUSE

On July 22, 2023 Brother (Dr.) Garry Kennebrew, Jr, along with more than 2000 cyclists, participated in the Annual Triple Bypass Cycling Event. Rider demographics vary but include the novice, professionals, teenagers, and senior citizens. The Triple Bypass is a 118-mile ride that begins in Evergreen, Colorado, and ends in Avon, Colorado. If the distance isn't challenging enough, riders must traverse and conquer three mountain passes (Juniper, Loveland, and Vail), which total nearly 11000 feet of climbing. This ride, on average, takes 6-12 hours to complete. Fortunately, there are several aid and water station strategies placed throughout the course. Also, to ease the apprehensive riders' concerns, the event is more than adequately staffed with personnel for any medical, mechanical, or other miscellaneous needs. A rider support document is published annually which includes details about the event, nutrition recommendations for the day, and other notes from previous experiences. The ride was established by a group of avid cyclists in July of 1988 and is currently sponsored by Team Evergreen (TE) Cycling.

When asked why? Brother Kennebrew responded with, "The registration proceeds go towards charity as TE cycling is the largest and most charitable bike club in the state of Colorado, donating over \$4 million to non-profit organizations, such as Special Olympics, the Boy Scouts, and others. Sponsors of the event also allow riders to do individual fundraising for a cause of their choosing. Those proceeds are donated in full to the associated fundraising entity. When asked if there was anything that he would like to say about the ride? Brother Kennebrew stated, "It is an opportunity to demonstrate what the human body can accomplish as it is an extremely challenging ride that pushes you beyond your mental and physical thresholds. Additionally, it is a great chance to garner proceeds for any cause you choose. Ideally, in the future, more cyclists can participate and continue to increase minority participation in not only cycling but promoting healthy lifestyles as well. Lastly, if the Triple Bypass seems daunting or even insurmountable, a Double Bypass option is offered. This includes only two of the three mountain passes for a total distance of approximately 80 miles with 6500 feet of climbing. When asked what his most memorable part of the ride was? He stated, "The gorgeous views, camaraderie, and crossing the finish line. Stay healthy. Stay fit, Stay alive!"



On Saturday, August 5, 2023, Communities In Schools (CIS-SA) staff and Omega Psi Phi Volunteers invited H-E-B customers to join the cause and donate supplies as part of their shopping experience.

From 9-5 at two HEB locations (Kitty Hawk and Alamo Ranch) in the Alamo City, the Brothers of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Incorporated, Psi Alpha Chapter, who have been involved in this worthwhile endeavor since 2007 rolled up their sleeves to ensure that local youths in the area would not go without school supplies for the year. On January 10, 2024, Bro. Billy Goffney was honored for hitting a major milestone in his basketball coaching career, as he celebrated his 500th coaching victory.

Bro. Goffney graduated from New Waverly High School in 1989, and from there attended Lamar University in Beaumont. He walked on to the basketball team as a freshman and was on the team for one season before that was ended by a coaching change. He remained at Lamar University and received a bachelor's degree in Kinesiology in 1994.

Bro. Goffney began his coaching career at his alma mater (New Waverly High School), where he spent the first 15 years of his career. He was the head track coach, assistant football coach, head JV football coach, and head JV Basketball coach, during his first five years at New Waverly High School. In his second year as head track coach, in 1996, Bro. Goffney was fortunate to coach a state track qualifier, Ebony Brown, who won the 200 meters and placed second in the 100 meters. In 1997, he had another athlete, Terrence Obryant, who qualified for state in the Long Jump and Triple Jump. In 2000, he was promoted to his passion, becoming the head basketball coach. He served in that capacity for 11 years and had an amazing run of success during his tenure as head coach, winning nine (9) District Championships, three (3) Regional Championships, and three (3) consecutive State Championship appearances (2008, 2009, 2010).

In all, Bro. Goffney compiled over 280 wins in those eleven years at New Waverly High School.

From 2011 to 2017, Bro. Goffney relocated to Longview, Texas, as the Head Coach, where he crossed the 300-win mark in 2013. In 2017, he became the head coach at Spring Westfield High School, where he still serves as the head basketball coach.

While at Westfield, Bro. Goffney and his teams have won three (3) District Championships and have been in the playoffs each season. In 2021, they advanced to the Regional tournament for the fifth time in his career. His team was also the #3 ranked team in the state of Texas and they were ranked #17 Nationally by Max Preps.

Bro. Goffney is currently in his 29th year of coaching, and his 23rd year as a head coach. On February 9, 2024, Bro. Goffney also led his Westfield boys basketball team to a victory over Nimitz, 50-39, to win the District 14-6A title.

Bro. Goffney was initiated into Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. on December 21, 2013, and is currently an active member of the Mu Mu Nu Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.

He is married to his wife, Monica, and they have two children—Brock and Mia.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH SPOTLIGHT: RUBY "MAXIE" REED

Mrs. Ruby Reed, often referred to as "Maxie" by her family and close friends, was the first Black female Principal in the Aldine Independent School District. She was born April 5, 1907, in Montgomery, TX, and was one of eleven children; eight of whom preceded her in death and was married to her husband of 70 years—Pastor James Reed—who also preceded her in death.

Mrs. Reed spent her entire 34-year career as an educator, having taught school for 23 years and having served as the Principal at A.B. Anderson Elementary for eleven years (in the 1960s). As a result of her dedicated service in the field of education, Aldine ISD honored Mrs. Reed by naming a school after her. The Ruby Maxie Reed Academy for Engineering is a S.T.E.M. magnet school that serves 1st through 5th graders and is in North Houston.

Mrs. Reed, a native Houstonian, was blessed to live 100 years as a devoted educator and mentor. She was a member of a large family and was a wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, and great-great-grandmother. Mrs. Reed was also well-liked and loved by her close friends, colleagues, and all who knew her storied contributions to education and who valued her friendship.

The Mu Mu Nu chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. is proud to place a spotlight on Mrs. Ruby Zenobia "Maxie" Reed, as we celebrate our rich African American history and the many contributions Blacks have made in America. We are also honored to be affiliated with the Ruby Reed Academy. Our chapter has hosted several community service events at the school such as the Holiday Food Distribution, Real Men Read Day, Backpack Giveaway, Welcome Back to School Day, Career Day, Teacher Appreciation Day, and Ruby Reed Sports Day.



Honestly, the real work begins when we admit our role in maintaining such a barrier that is well worth being broken down brick by brick to build a strong, fortified structure for ourselves, our family, fraternity, and the community at large. We must take the initiative and get more involved!

It is a pleasant feeling to see the works of Bro. Leon Spencer III (Spr. 09 TE) and his Omega Training Camp take off at Lamp speed across the entire map. We often offer many excuses for why we neglect hitting the gym and being OWT. His platform offers a great solution to the mentioned barriers. A DAY WHERE THE SICK CAN NO LONGER GO TO A DOCTOR'S OFFICE TO BE EXAMINED BUT ONLY BY A VIRTUAL CALL BECAUSE OF FEAR THAT LIES WITHIN THE REASONING THAT IT WOULD REDUCE SICKNESS FROM SPREADING TO OTHERS. NOW I DON'T GET IT AND THEN I BELIEVE I DO. FOR ME I FALL SHORT OF THAT REASONING BECAUSE WE ONCE WENT TO THE DOCTOR'S OFFICE SICK AND CONTAGIOUS WITH NO ISSUES BUT WITH THE HOPE OF BEING TREATED AND GETTING WELL. POLITICAL PARTIES ARE FIGHTING TO SEE WHO SHALL LEAD THIS GREAT NATION WITH NO TRUE THOUGHT FOR THE PEOPLE BUT THEIR OWN AGENDA OF WHAT THEY BELIEVE THE PEOPLE NEED. AND IF THAT IS NOT STRANGE ENOUGH FOR YOU, IN FIGHTING AMONGST THE PARTIES THEMSELVES. TECHNOLOGY HAS REMOVED PERSONAL ENGAGEMENT FROM HUMANITY AND IF THAT WAS NOT ENOUGH, THE PRESENT-DAY PANDEMIC HAS SHUT IT DOWN TOGETHER WITH NO FACE-TO-FACE CONTACT DISTANCING OURSELVES FROM ONE ANOTHER CREATED BY THE FEAR THAT WE MAY BE CONTAGIOUS AND SPREAD THE VIRUS. SOCIETY CAN NOW ENABLE WHAT IS ACCEPTABLE AND WHAT IS NOT DESPITE THE MORALITY OF ITS SINFUL NATURE.

I WISH I HAD TIME TO FURTHER EXPOUND ON THE MANY ISSUES OF SEPARATION BUT I DON'T. BUT WILL LET YOU KNOW IF YOU ARE NOT ALREADY AWARE, THAT THE HOUSE OF OMEGA FACES SOME OF THESE SAME ISSUES. THE GREATER-THAN-THOU SYNDROME WITHOUT THE DUTY OF EARNING THE RESPECT TO RECEIVE RESPECT. LEADING ONE'S OWN AGENDA WITH THE BELIEF ONE KNOWS WHAT'S BEST FOR THE BODY WITHOUT A TRULY DEMOCRATIC PROCESS. AND NOT SUBMITTING TO WHAT IT TRULY TAKES TO BE A GREAT LEADER. LIVING THE ALPHA MALE CONCEPT, EVERYONE IS THE LEADER AND NOT A FOLLOWER. ALWAYS WANTING TO BE AT THE FOREFRONT WITH NO QUALITIES TO FULFILL THE OBLIGATION OF THE POSITION. WANTING TO BE HEARD JUST FOR THE APPEARANCE OF BEING IMPORTANT.



THESE TYPES OF CHARACTERISTICS MERELY CAUSE SEPARATION AND DIVISION. IF WE TRULY WANT TO BE EFFECTIVE LET'S TALK FROM THE THOUGHT PROCESS OF HUMBLENESS AND HUMILITY IS THE PROVISION OF UNITY BASED ON OUR CHRISTIAN PRINCIPLE THAT OUR FOUNDERS BUILT THE PILLARS ON FOR THIS GREAT FRATERNAL ORGANIZATION.

BIBLICAL DEFINITION:

·HUMBLENESS - ONE WHO IS MORE FOCUSED ON GOD INSTEAD OF OTHERS AND SELF.

·HUMILITY — FREEDOM FROM ARROGANCE THAT GROWS OUT OF THE RECOGNITION THAT ALL WE HAVE AND ARE COMES FROM GOD, OUR SUPREME BASILEUS OF THE UNIVERSE. NOW THE BIBLE TELLS US THIS DOES NOT REPRESENT NOR IMPLY INADEQUACY, LACK OF DIGNITY, AND WORTHLESSNESS. BUT IS KEEPING OUR BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES AS CHRIST DEFINES IT AS: "TAKE MY YOKE UPON YOU, AND LEARN OF ME; FOR I AM MEEK AND LOWLY IN HEART; AND YE SHALL FIND REST UNTO YOUR SOULS. FOR MY YOKE IS EASY, AND MY BURDEN IS LIGHT. MATTHEW 11:29 (KJV)

HUMILITY IS NOT BELITTLING ONESELF BUT EXALTING OR PRAISING OTHERS, ESPECIALLY GOD AND CHRIST. "FOR I SAY, THROUGH THE GRACE GIVEN UNTO ME, TO EVERY MAN THAT IS AMONG YOU, NOT TO THINK OF HIMSELF MORE HIGHLY THAN HE OUGHT TO THINK, BUT TO THINK SOBERLY, ACCORDING AS GOD HATH DEALT TO EVERY MAN THE MEASURE OF FAITH." ROMANS 12:3 (KJV)

·UNITY — ONENESS, HARMONY, AGREEMENT. UNITY WAS APPARENT ON THE DAY OF PENTECOST WHEN THE BELIEVERS WERE ALL IN ONE ACCORD IN ONE PLACE. THE CHURCH IS A UNITY IN THE DIVERSITY OF FELLOWSHIP. FAITH. HOPE. AND LOVE THAT BINDS BELIEVERS TOGETHER.

WE MUST LEAVE PRIDE, ARROGANCE, SELF-SERVING AGENDAS, SELFISH GAINS, AND THE DESIRE TO BE THE GREATER OF ALL OR THE POWER SOURCE. LET'S BE TRUE BRIDGE BUILDERS IN EVERY SENSE OF THE WORD'S MEANING BY LAYING OUT THE DRIVING CONCEPT OF WHAT A BRIDGE BUILDER LOOKS LIKE. AND THAT CAN'T OCCUR UNLESS WE ARE LIKE-MINDED AND ON ONE ACCORD TO CREATE A UNITED FRONT. THEN AND ONLY THEN CAN WE BE TRULY EFFECTIVE IN OUR FRATERNITY, THE COMMUNITY, AND THE WORLD. WE ARE CONSTANTLY UNDER WATCH. WE CANNOT BE SEEN WITH IN-HOUSE FIGHTING CAUSING CONFUSION AND SEPARATION BECAUSE WE'RE LIVING THE WRONG MEANING OF THE ALPHA MALE CONCEPT. LET US BE THE CHRIST-LIKE EXAMPLE OF HUMBLENESS AND HUMILITY AS THE PROVISION OF UNITY.
